Monthly Economic Update: Labor trends for selected industries and regions

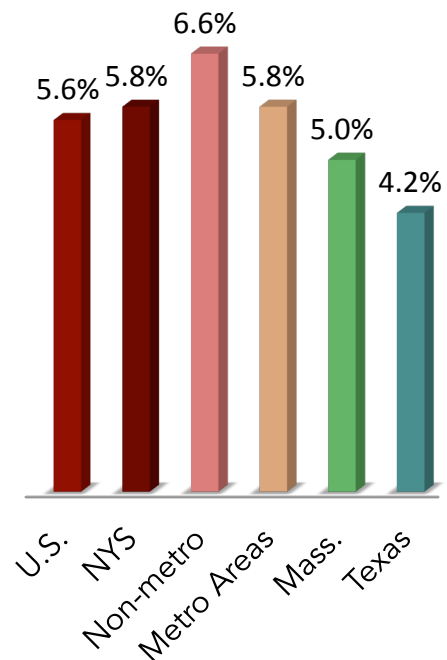
New York's private-sector added jobs in March, though the manufacturing sector continued to lose ground. The state's unemployment rate, especially in non-metro counties, was above the national average for the same period.
