

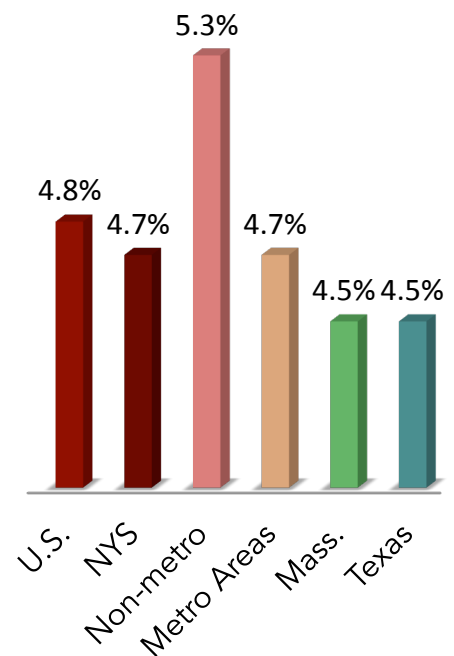
Monthly Economic Update: *Labor trends for selected industries and regions*

New York's private sector added jobs at a slightly higher rate than the national average from November 2014 to November 2015. However, the state's non-metro areas continued to have higher-than-average unemployment rates over the same period.
