

Monthly Economic Update: *Labor trends for selected industries and regions*

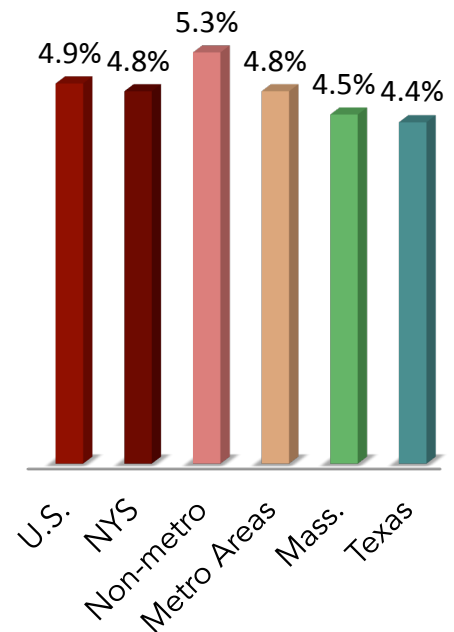
September's job numbers show continued progress in New York's overall economy, with private sector jobs growing by 135,000 or 1.7 percent over the past 12 months.
